**Reflecting on the Gospel: September 15<sup>th</sup>** : *"Who do people say that I am?"*

Abuse, injustice, illness or disease is not *"the cross"* in the sense in which Jesus speaks of it in today's gospel. There is nothing particularly Christian about this kind of suffering; it can happen to anyone. Jesus confronted and tried to stop that kind of suffering whenever he encountered it. The cross consists rather in the negative consequences to which Jesus's followers willingly expose themselves as the cost of being his disciples.

Peter does not seem to hear that Jesus gives him the end of the story; the suffering is something only to be passed through. We do everything in our power to relieve suffering, and we would rather not confront the truth that suffering is an inevitable part of every life. Relieving suffering is good – it is often the work that Christ calls us to – but it is not the end of the story. The end of every Christian's story is our sharing in the resurrection after passing through suffering like Jesus did.
